Monthly Briefing Information - 24 August 2023 Reminder about the new information and advice e-learning course for professionals

As part of Adult Social Care's commitment to improving information and advice in health and social care settings, a new e-learning course entitled "Information and advice resources about care and support and health and wellbeing" has been created.

This aims to help professionals understand and navigate what online information and support is available that can provide answers quickly and efficiently across a variety of subject areas, especially at key points in a resident's care pathway.

The training has been devised to help professionals support residents, carers, and their families on how to make informed decisions about the care and support they need, helping them to make better decisions and stay independent, safe, and well.

Surrey County Council and Adult Social Care staff can access the training directly via Olive. NHS colleagues, and external providers and partners can register or login to the

Surrey Skills Academy e-learning platform to access the course:

Take Five to Age Well

From 1 September 2023, The Open University is launching a free, UK-wide public health campaign: <u>Take Five to Age Well</u>. The campaign will invite people to join a community, making small daily changes for better ageing across five categories: Eat, Drink, Move, Connect, and Engage and Think. People sign up online and commit to

30 days of healthy ageing habits that will boost their health and wellbeing now and into the future.

All content is evidence-based and expert-led, helping to bring a lasting positive impact. People will be offered various support channels including regular emails and a coaching app, informed by behavioural change techniques. This is open to everyone - ageing well research suggests "the sooner the better but never too late" to adopt these habits.

Carers' Organisations Grants available

The Surrey County Council and NHS Surrey Heartlands Better Care Fund Grant Programme aims to help local providers, voluntary, community and faith sector organisations to start or grow innovative projects which support unpaid carers in Surrey to improve their health and wellbeing.

One-off grants of up to a maximum of £25,000 per successful applicant will be awarded. There are two separate rounds of the carers' organisations grant; one focusing on improving the health and wellbeing of carers of people with dementia (including young onset dementia) or autistic people; and the other focusing on improving the emotional wellbeing and mental health of young carers.

Community Project In Spelthorne Awarded £900k Grant From Your Fund Surrey

Surrey County Council's Cabinet has approved Ashford Community Hub's application to receive funding of approximately £900k towards a new building.

The hub will provide space for a variety of classes catering to the needs of different groups, from mother and baby yoga, to fall prevention classes tailored specifically for individuals over 70, as well as further capacity for local Scouts, Beavers, and Cubs groups. As a result, there is an anticipated increase in skills and volunteering opportunities for residents.

The new building will be used by charities and not for profit community groups with a particular focus on supporting community health and wellbeing and reducing social isolation. It will provide a range of activities which are not currently available in the Ashford, Staines and Stanwell areas as well as providing the new home for 8th Ashford Scouts.

New Web Resources From Trauma-Informed Surrey And North East Hampshire

Trauma-Informed Surrey and North East Hampshire, drive trauma-informed system-wide change through co-produced training and consultation, using a framework founded on evidence-based, globally recognised principles. It is a partnership between Surrey and Borders Partnership NHS Foundation Trust, Surrey Heartlands Health and Care Partnership, Frimley Health and Care and Surrey County Council.

The team has recently launched a <u>web hub</u> to support organisations in their trauma informed journey. The resource features details of upcoming training, information and resources for people and organisations who want to apply trauma informed principles in their work. Training and consultation are currently available to organisations that are part of the Changing Futures Programme and the Mental Health Crisis Care Concordat.

Three New Surrey Sites Earmarked For Extra Care Housing
Three new Surrey sites have been earmarked for affordable extra
care housing which will offer older people their own front door and
round-the-clock access to care and support if they need it. Extra care
housing supports older people to live their best lives, independently
and in a home of their own, and is different from residential care
homes.

The three proposed new sites are:

- Former Orchard Court care home, Lingfield
- Former Birchlands care home, Englefield Green
- · Colebrook, Redhill.

These latest three sites could provide around 220 apartments. A Care Quality Commission-registered care provider will be selected for each development to provide a 24-hour on-site presence and deliver care and support plans according to each tenant's needs. Residents will also be offered access to pioneering technology which uses hi-tech sensors fitted in everyday objects to help keep them safe and identify early health warning signs.

Update from Oakleaf Enterprise Guildford Safe Haven renovation

The <u>Guildford Safe Haven renovation</u> has now been completed. The Guildford Safe Haven is an out-of-hours crisis centre based at Oakleaf's premises and is provided in partnership with Surrey and Borders Partnership NHS Foundation and Catalyst Support. It is open from 6pm-11pm every day, 7 days a week, 365 days a year for anyone experiencing a mental health crisis.

The Young Adult Safe Haven is also open 5pm-9pm, 7 days a week for 18-25 year olds in need of emotional support.
