Affordable Extra Care Housing A Step Closer For Surrey

Planning permission was awarded to the first of the county council's extra care housing developments Pond Meadow, Guildford.

Working with extra care housing consortium partner Pond Meadow Limited, the site in Guildford will provide 59 affordable apartments for those who need help to continue living the lives they want in a home of their own. This forms part of Surrey County Council's plan to provide high quality, purpose-built accommodation for those most in need of extra care and support and deliver on commitments outlined in Surrey's <u>'Living Well in Later Life' strategy</u>.

Major Grant Awarded To Surrey County Council To Help Reduce Health Inequalities

A major grant of around £5 million has been awarded to Surrey County Council and the University of Surrey to tackle poor health and health inequalities in Surrey. The investment from the National Institute of Health Research (NIHR) is for a Health Determinants Research Collaboration (HDRC) that will bring together experts from the council, university and other partners to ensure a research-led and evidence-based approach to meeting health priorities.

HDRCs are designed to centre around local residents who will influence policymaking by setting research priorities. The grant will enable evidence to be compiled for what works, for who and when to improve and protect the health of the population. Aiming to build the evidence for how to meet the needs of local people, the grant will facilitate research to inform how lifestyle, social, economic, built and natural environment factors (also known as the wider determinants of health) affect health, for example: poor housing conditions, food poverty and air quality.

CQC: Local Authority Pilot Assessments Published

The Care Quality Commission (CQC) has recently published the <u>findings from</u> <u>their pilot assessments</u> looking at five local authorities; Birmingham, Lincolnshire, North Lincolnshire, Nottingham and Suffolk.

Assessing how local authorities meet their duties under Part 1 of the Care Act (2014) is a new responsibility for CQC. During the pilots, they looked at nine quality statements to assess how well each local authority is meeting its responsibilities and to give an indicative rating.

They used the pilot assessments to test the new <u>assessment framework</u>, methods and processes before starting formal assessments of all 153 local authorities with adult social care responsibilities. These will start from December, pending government approval.

More Support In Sight For Carers As New Short Breaks Accommodation Gains Approval

Surrey County Council's plans to increase short break accommodation for autistic people and those with learning disabilities have received a boost after planning permission was granted for a new development at Goldsworth Park in Woking.

Situated on the site of the former Lakers Youth Centre, the building will provide eight ensuite bedrooms designed to be fully accessible to wheelchair users and those with complex needs.

Short breaks accommodation offers those who look after autistic people and adults with learning disabilities the opportunity to take a well-earned break from

their caring responsibilities. Parents or other unpaid carers have a chance to recharge their batteries and concentrate on their own wellbeing, while their loved ones are supported in a location close to home, developing new social skills and meeting others from the local community. Construction is expected to start in the first half of 2024, with completion by early 2025. For further information, please visit Lakers short break service.

Free Truecall Devices Available From Trading Standards

<u>Buckinghamshire and Surrey Trading Standards</u> is cracking down on telephone scammers this festive season by encouraging people with vulnerable family or friends to support them in applying for a free* <u>trueCall device</u>, to prevent

telephone scammers and nuisance callers getting through on landlines.

Every year, many people in the UK fall victim to fraudsters. Scams take different forms, but the most common is for fraudsters to cold call. Trading Standards estimate that 48,000 scam or nuisance calls were blocked by the trueCall devices in the two boroughs, installed in the year August 2022 to August 2023, saving residents a total of £1,824,971.

Living Longer Better Funding Support From Active Surrey

Active Surrey has commissioned Funding 4 Sport to help organisations in Surrey to submit funding applications for physical activity projects (up to the value of £20k) to help get older people moving more.

Warmth Matters Helpline And Advice Sessions With Surrey Community Action

Surrey Community Action's <u>Warmth Matters project</u> aims to tackle fuel poverty across Surrey by providing energy advice and assistance, from helping families struggling with energy bills payments to empowering individuals to take action, such as switching supplier, signing up for new grants and schemes, and providing homeowners with the knowledge and advice they need to make their homes more energy-efficient.

Latest Training Available From Headway Surrey In-service training

In-service training is available for those working with residents with a brain injury and is suitable for health and social care professionals, lawyers, case managers, schools and sports clubs.

Understanding Brain Injury

Starting on the 15 January, this six-week course is for adults with an acquired brain injury (ABI), including traumatic brain injury, and costs £80, however, there are concessions available. It offers the opportunity to learn more about the brain, the consequences and impairments associated with brain injury, e.g., memory, concentration, and emotional and behavioural difficulties. As well as practical advice, there is plenty of time to discuss issues, ask questions and share experiences.

There are six sessions run in a friendly and relaxed group format with our qualified Rehabilitation Coordinators, who specialise in brain injury. Sessions last 60 to 90 minutes and include one hour topic content with 30 minutes at the end for discussion and questions. Hospital Hoppa launches in Cranleigh

<u>Hospital Hoppa</u> will now provide hospital transport for the residents in Cranleigh unable to get to the hospital or health appointments via other means of transport. The buses are accessible to people in wheelchairs and people with pushchairs.

The bus will pick you up from your home or care home at an agreed time and drop you off at your appointment. If needed, they can take you home from your appointment and will always see you safely inside. You can book your transport as soon as you receive your appointment.
