Monthly Briefing Information Correct As Of 20 July 2023 New Information And Advice E-Learning Course For Professionals

As part of Adult Social Care's commitment to improving information and advice in health and social care settings, a new e-learning course entitled "**Information and advice resources about care and support and health and wellbeing**" has been created.

This aims to help professionals understand and navigate what online information and support is available that can provide answers quickly and efficiently across a variety of subject areas, especially at key points in a resident's care pathway.

The training has been devised to help professionals support residents, carers, and their families on how to make informed decisions about the care and support they need, helping them to make better decisions and stay independent, safe, and well.

To demonstrate the power and impact of information and advice, three animated videos using different people scenarios have been commissioned, as well as explaining Adult Social Care's strengths-based approach in information and advice provision, and which features in the e-learning.

Surrey County Council and ASC staff can access the training directly via Olive. NHS colleagues, and external providers and partners can register or login to the

Chatty Café Scheme Comes To West Central Coffee Shop In Redhill

The Chatty Café scheme is the UK's leading non-profit organisation tackling loneliness.

They offer three services, all designed to reduce loneliness and/or isolation:

- Face to face meet ups where venues offer 'Chatter and Natter' tables, where customers can get together and chat. There are hundreds of venues around the UK, many Chatter and Natter tables are hosted by Chatty Table Volunteers.
- Online Chatty Café sessions held every Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday from 1.30pm to 1.30pm. Anyone over eighteen can join, simply to chat to others.
- A telephone friendship service for anyone over eighteen who is experiencing loneliness and could benefit from a weekly chat on the phone.

West Central coffee shop in Redhill will be hosting a Chatter and Natter table every Thursday, 10am to 12pm.

Give your views: learning disability and autism training for health and social care workers

The government want to hear views about guidance covering learning disability and autism training for people who work in health and social care.

Over £10m awarded for projects through Your Fund Surrey

This month's Surrey County Council Cabinet Meeting saw some important decisions made on behalf of Surrey residents, including a fantastic milestone for [Your Fund Surrey](#).

Yvonne Arnaud Theatre in Guildford will be awarded more than £2.9m from the Your Fund Surrey Community Project Fund, taking the total funds awarded to communities across Surrey to over £10m since its launch in November 2020.

The money will be used to improve the accessibility of the entire theatre and ensure existing and new community spaces be accessible for a variety of new groups, building on the community initiatives and outreach programmes already delivered by the theatre.

Half Price Bus Fares For Under Twenties In Surrey

Young people aged twenty and under are now entitled to 50% off all bus journeys across Surrey.

A new '[LINK](#)' card has been developed by Surrey County Council which can be shown on any bus in Surrey to qualify for the discount on all single and return journeys.

Journeys should start and/or end in Surrey and people in the qualifying age group must live in the county.

Changing Futures - Bridge the Gap

Surrey has secured an additional £1.1m until March 2025 to continue to support its most vulnerable adults experiencing homelessness, substance use, mental health and neuro-divergent challenges, domestic abuse and/or contact with the criminal justice system, to make positive life changes while making sure they do not fall through gaps between services.

"Bridge the Gap" is a relational model of long-term specialist community outreach provided by trauma informed specialists commissioned locally through an alliance of Surrey Voluntary, Community and Social Enterprise Organisations and is one of several interrelated projects funded by the Department of Levelling Up Housing and Communities and the National Lottery under the Changing Future Programme. The aims of the programme include achieving improved outcomes for people experiencing multiple disadvantages, at an individual, system and service level.

An evaluation of the Changing Futures Programme to date identifies positive outcomes for individuals and an excellent potential return in investment. Experts by experience in partnership with the Changing Futures Programme Team are delighted with the accomplishments to date and will continue to seek long term sustainable funding for this pioneering programme.

Armed Forces Awareness Training

It is now a legal requirement for local authorities to ensure 'due regard' for Armed Forces Communities in the provision of certain key

services.

- What challenges are they likely to face?
- How to understand their needs?
- Where are the Military in the local area?
- How to link with Armed Forces Charities and how they can help.
