Everyone is invited to provide their feedback on the proposed relocation of Staines Library to create a new community hub. Inspectors Praise Surrey Fire And Rescue Service's Improved Culture

Following an inspection of the service by His Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabulary and Fire & Rescue Service (HMICFRS) throughout March and April, inspectors published their report, praising the 'positive working culture' at Surrey Fire and Rescue Service.'

The report further outlines areas where the service has done well, areas for improvement and a 'cause of concern' regarding the risk-based inspection programme. Surrey Fire and Rescue Service is bringing together an improvement plan to address all of the areas for improvement that have been highlighted in the report.
